Housing Assistance:

<u>Utilities:</u> If you have outstanding utility bills (e.g., electricity, gas, or water), LCS can assist with those bills.

Food: *LCS* can provide your members with boxes of food. These boxes are prepared by fellow union members and can feed a family of four.

Masks/Air Quality: The air quality across Southern California will be significantly impacted for an extended period. If you have respiratory concerns, LCS can provide high-quality face masks for distribution to your members in need.
